Heidi graduated from St. Olaf College with a BA in philosophy. After being a Volunteer in Mission with Presbyterian Church in Thailand where she taught English as a foreign language, she studied at McCormick Theological Seminary, graduating in 1983. She was ordained later that year in the PC (USA) and served as an associate pastor in Illinois. In 1989 she moved to the Kansas City area where she has worked for several Presbyterian Churches as well as serving on the Heartland Presbytery staff for stewardship and mission. She was the moderator of Heartland Presbytery in 2004 and is currently serving as the moderator of the Heartland Presbytery Council. She is also the pastor of an urban congregation in a church that is 150 years old. She speaks of serving a "gritty and compassionate bunch of believers."

Operation Christmas Child

Take an ordinary shoe box,

fill it with toys, school supplies, hygiene items, socks and candy and you have an extraordinary gift for a child in need of joy and hope!

Women With Spirit is sponsoring a packing party at Church on Saturday, November 19 from 9:00 am-Noon in Friendship Hall. Come spend time with your family and friends at Village packing and wrapping your shoe boxes. Cookies and hot chocolate will be served!

Instructions on Packing:

- 1. Pick-up a brochure with packing instructions at church.
- 2. Find an empty shoe box (standard size please). Wrap it-lid separately.
- 3. Decide whether your gift will be for a boy or girl and the age category: 2-4, 5-9 or 10-14. Cut out the appropriate label from the brochure, tape it on the top of your box, and mark the correct age category.
- 4. Fill the box with a variety of gifts and a note or photo of yourself or family. (If you include your name and address the child may write back.)
- 5. Enclose a check for \$5 or more (payable to Samaritan's purse, and note in the memo line that the gift is for Operation Christmas Child) in the envelope attached to the brochure to help cover shipping costs.

Suggested gifts:

Toys: small cars, balls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yo's, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky, etc.

School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, coloring books, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, etc.

Hygiene items: toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc. Other: hard candy, lollipops, mints, gum, sunglasses, flashlights (with extra batteries), ball caps, socks, T-shirts, toy jewelry, hair clips, watches, small picture books, etc.

Do Not Include:

Used or damaged items, War related items, chocolate or food, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items and aerosol cans.

Breath Prayer: Do not be afraid...We have news of great joy!!

Join us for the December lesson entitled, "Christmas: A Time to be Born, and a Time to Die." The scripture lessons are from Ecclesiastes 3:2; Mark 6:2-3; Luke 1:1-2. 38

"A time to be born---" For Christians, Christmas is a time we celebrate the birth of Christ on December 25. But we find that the actual birth date of Christ is unknown and has been celebrated at various times throughout the ages. Many years ago in England, Christmas was celebrated for 12 days. But when the Puritans settled in the New World, they forbade the mention of December 25 as Christ's birthday and as a holiday. Christians mark Advent as the time to anticipate Christ's birth, but popular culture makes sure by August we know Christmas is not far away.

"A time to die---" The Gospel writers were well aware that Jesus' birth was a miracle but they also understood that the crucifixion was part of the mystery. Believers at this time also understood the purpose God achieved in Jesus.

The Christmas story is about Christ being born into the world so that he can die and save the world. Life is found even in death---for death is not the final word but the beginning of a new and glorious life.

The women sang wearing a colorful variety of the beautiful long traditional dresses of the Korean people. Don't miss this wonderful treat in November.

The Korean women, who hosted the gathering at Shawnee Presbyterian Church, also served and explained several delicious traditional Korean dishes for lunch. Rev. Glenda Watts assisted with the meeting which also featured guest speaker, Jose Chipenda, an international peace maker from Angola, and a presentation on Korean culture by a young woman who came to this country with her parents when she was two years old.

St. Vincent's Reading Program

Three and four year olds have been coming to Village this Fall to participate in the St. Vincent's Reading program. It has been a very exciting year. We had such a wonderful response from people who wanted to give their time to these kids and this program, that we were able to invite an additional class.

We have an average of 30 kids per session with a potential for 40 kids, and about the same number of volunteers. We have had a lot of fun reading group stories, having a snack, doing crafts, and of course, individual reading between the volunteers and the children. The children have been able to take home 2 books each session—that means Village church has given these kids a total of at least 480 books! The pride of ownership is evident in these kids.

Many thanks to Joyce Gosnell for igniting the imagination of our reading group on October 18. Joyce became a clown before our eyes. It was delightfully entertaining, and we learned a lot too.

WWS held a Halloween party on October 25 for the St. Vincent's Reading Program. They generously donated costumes for all the kids to take home as well as a Halloween themed book. Thank you to all the Reading Program volunteers who donated books and costumes as well!

Thank you to all those kind enough to donate books to the St. Vincent's Reading Program. It would be increasingly difficult to continue without your generosity. The Tomahawk Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution donated approximately 100 books, and the Reading Program volunteers have been equally as generous.
